

OTHER SERVICES

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES:

Respite services are provided to children and adults with disabilities that reside at home. Funding is under the Home and Community Based Waiver Program. Services are provided to a person in their home while the family needs time away.

These services were designed to support and provide skills and activities for daily living to adults and children with disabilities. We want to support people to become as independent as possible by giving them the skills and knowledge they need.

WORK SERVICES:

Vocational services are designed to provide paid, meaningful work for people with disabilities. Each person served in the work service program develops a sense of pride and self-worth along with learning to work with others and produce quality work. Our recycling program provides sustainable work and a way to give back to the world in which we live.

CONNECT:

Starting in the spring of 2011 Crossroads will offer group respite services. The services will be offered at 1529 9th Ave, Council Bluffs. The program is designed to give family members and primary care givers personal time.

CWI is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities in Organizational Community Employment, and Community Integration.
